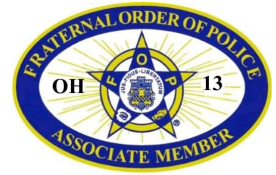

Alan Duvall dedicated his life to public service through his commitment to the welfare and safety of others. During his career, he served as an intermittent Deputy US Marshal, a Court Security Officer, Lead Officer, and Supervisor of Court Security for the Northern District of West Virginia, ensuring the safety of all those entering the Federal Courthouse in Wheeling. For 30 years, on Monday evenings, he volunteered as a Special Deputy for the Belmont County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Duvall also revived and served as President of the FOPA Lodge #13.

Alan was very committed to his values and beliefs. With the BCSO he provided his leadership, knowledge, and experience to the next generation of law enforcement. He supported the Hunter's Education Program and was devoted to the "Shop with a Deputy" program. With this Scholarship Program, his legacy will continue.

For graduating seniors who intend to pursue a career in law enforcement and attend a post-secondary program that offers law enforcement career pathways. Applicants must reside and attend school in Belmont County. Two five hundred (\$500) dollar scholarships will be awarded.
